From Woody: I read a story in this morning's UNION LEADER about increasing numbers of people who are not engaging news. It is understandable but also disturbing. The news media focuses on controversy and bad news. That is because bad news is, by definition, news. That is not to say that they also shouldn't cover good news and they do. Both print and electronic media often run stories about people and organizations who do great things for many people. But as I sometimes share in talking with people, when I did radio

news I didn't report on the air every school bus that safely arrived at the local schools in the morning but if one bus was in an accident of some kind, that would lead a local newscast because that was the exception and people needed to know that. So news coverage does more reporting on something negative.

As for controversy, that is also important in the democracy we live in. If we take seriously our role as citizens, then we need to have an understanding of the issues that shape our town, state, country and world. I believe that those sorts of issues, which often are full of controversy are ones that God is concerned about. These are questions of war and peace, of justice and fairness, of who we strive to be as Americans. These kinds of issues have been with us since the beginning of time. The Old Testament prophets certainly proclaimed that God wants us to treat everyone with kindness and justice. Jesus, in the Sermon on the Mount, talks about how we, as his followers, should treat our fellow human beings. It is significant that the crucial issues of our history, like slavery and racism, war and peace and economic justice have seen significant leadership from Christian churches. In our lifetime certainly Dr. King's Civil Rights Movement had great leadership from Christian and Jewish leaders,

So we walk a fine line...trying to maintain our own mental health by not being overwhelmed by the harsh political words of the news in these times, but also doing what we can to support policies that lead to peace, justice and understanding. With God's presence, we are both called to act according to Jesus' teaching but also not to forget that God is with us, loves us and reminds us to take time for our own mental health and that of our family and friends. It is not always an easy task.
