**From Woody:** . .It was 60 years ago this month that my high school class at Garden City, New York graduated. There was a lot going on in the world at that time. President Kennedy gave a Civil Rights Address to the nation, the first President to do that. It was on the evening of the day when Governor George Wallace blocked the door at the University of Alabama to prevent the entrance of a black student. He got out of the way after his grandstanding action. That night, as JFK gave his national television address, a racist

named Byron De La Beckwith was on his way to murder the head of the NAACP in Mississippi, Medgar Evers, as he pulled into his driveway after a late night at the office. De La Beckwith was found not guilty by an all white jury. Years later he finally was sent to prison due to the efforts of Evers' wife. The day before this JFK gave his Peace Speech at the Commencement of the Class of 1963 at American University. That speech resulted in a treaty between the USSR and the USA banning the testing of nuclear weapons in the atmosphere. Later that summer Martin Luther King gave his I HAVE A DREAM speech at the Lincoln Memorial. In the fall JFK instructed Robert McNamara to withdraw 1,000 of our 15,000 military advisors in Viet Nam by Jan. 1, 1964. It was a time of hope and promise which was shattered on Nov. 22 when the President went to Dallas. Leaders like Martin Luther King and John Kennedy inspired us with visions of a world moving toward Jesus' vision of the Kingdom of God. We need that kind of vision again.
