Her name is Caitlin Clark who led her Iowa University women's basketball team to straight national championship finals and set an all-time college basketball scoring record for basketball players, female or male. She now is playing in the WNBA. She seems to be resented by many of the players in that league. Much of that may be that the attention

(and attendance) is setting records and some of the players attribute that to her being white and straight. It is understandable, to some extent, that some of the wonderful black athletes in that league attribute her immediate impact to her being white. It also may have some truth that some of the players who are gay resent the attention because she is straight. She has been treated roughly but seems to do her best and to keep her cool. Ticket sales and TV ratings are soaring due, in large part, to her presence. She is going to make money for the whole league by increasing interest in women's basketball.

Her plight seems to beg the question, did she choose to be white and straight? Did some of the players who are treating her harshly choose to be black or gay? Obviously, the answer is no. None of us choose our race or our sexual identity. Our biological parents and for believers, God, made those decisions. We all are who we are. If we believe that, then we should not be angry or dismissive of anyone's race or orientation. Jesus taught us to love one another and try to help one another. All of the women of the WNBA are wonderful athletes and deserve credit for the hard work they put in to play so well the sport they love. My hope is that we all can learn from this that we don't choose many aspects of who we are as people. We can choose how we use the talents we have. May the WNBA prosper and get over the resentments that are prevalent and remind us that we all come from different places but we all can work to build up one another.
