From Woody: Here is a true and very moving story appropriate for the 4th of July. Two of the main people in the story of the birth of the United States are John Adams and Thomas Jefferson. Both were movers in the Continental Congress and were on the committee to write the Declaration of Independence. Jefferson was the writer with help and suggestions from Adams and Benjamin Franklin. Adams and Jefferson went to Europe and together convinced the French to aid the colonists, and this made it possible

to win the Revolutionary War. After the writing of the Constitution Washington was elected President and John Adams Vice President. Washington served for two terms and then Adams was elected with Jefferson as his Vice President (the Vice President at that time was decided by whoever finished second in the Electoral College vote). While Jefferson was Vice President he secretly funded a man to produce nasty political advertising, pamphlets in those days, attacking Adams. In the next election Jefferson defeated Adams and when Adams found out what Jefferson had been doing he left Washington before Jefferson's inauguration. The two men ceased all contact with each other. A friend of both of them, Dr. Benjamin Rush, (also a signer of the Declaration) convinced both men to contact the other and end their many years of enmity. They then began writing letters back and forth and rekindled their friendship. As the country prepared to celebrate the 50th Anniversary of the Declaration on July 4, 1826, Adams and Jefferson were each invited to Washington for the event. Neither man could attend because of ill health and sent their regrets. Early in the morning of July 4, 1826, Jefferson died at Monticello. Later in the day Adams died in Quincy, Massachusetts. Adams. last words were. "Jefferson still lives." Obviously, news traveled much less rapidly in 1826 and Adams, not having heard the news from Virginia, remembered his friend and fellow patriot with his last breath. We owe much to these two men and also to Benjamin Rush for helping them renew their friendship. It is another reminder from history that we are better together.
