I was New Hampshire Red Cross State Disaster Chairman for ten years. And those years represented not only State and National Red Cross but also other organizations active during disasters. For ten years I attended state exercises in Concord. I am writing to share information that is important to know how to help people who have suffered the current hurricane disaster in the southeastern part of our country. For a disaster of that size, it takes hundreds of trained people from many organizations and great quantities of materials. People should know or learn that individual donations of materials are of no use. The people trained to meet the needs the disaster, require many truck loads or train loads of materials including water, food and clothing. Individual gifts are in the way and are thrown away. What is needed is cash. Any donation of cash is shared among organizations on site where needs are being met.

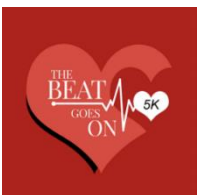
